
# **Key Findings on Education Communities Speak Fall 2022 Survey**

#### **Children Enrolled in Public School**




#### **Satisfaction with Child's Schooling**

#### **Dissatisfaction with Child's Public Schooling**







White, Hispanic/Latinx, and Asian respondents reported moved their child to a different school predominately because the school was "not meeting their child's academic needs"





#### Did not Have Access to Childcare when Needed





#### Over 1 out of 3 Households
